International Baseball Match Is a Feature For This After- noon.

Junior Lacrosse Match to be Played At Caledonia Park.

The Chehalis team arrived here yesterday afternoon on the Sound steamer, and are a most promising looking lot of young men. They are a strong, husky looking team, and if appearances count for anything, the local team will have no easy job on hand today. They have among their players one man who has played here before, Prigmore, who played third base here for the University of Washington team early in the season. The team has a very good record, having lost but few games this season. The only games lost were one to the Tacoma Greys and one to Centralia, but they have since defeated the Centralia nine two games. The boys were very glad to be able to have a good night's sleep before their game, as almost all of them suffered from sea-sickness on their way over. This is no doubt one of the reasons of the poor showings made by several teams from the other side that have played here this season. The Chehalis boys by arriving a day ahead of time will have an opportunity of recovering from their little experience on the Straits, and will no doubt be in good condition for the game. They will be out at Oak Bay for practice this morning in order to get a bit used to the grounds.

The Victorias had their last practice on Thursday evening and all hands are in fine form for the hard game they expect today. Holness will do the twirling, and he will no doubt keep the visitors guessing to solve his curves. Schwengers will do the receiving.

The game will be called promptly at 3 o'clock, so that every one can be back in town by 5 o'clock or very shortly after. The tramway company will put on sufficient extra cars to handle the crowd.
