











<u>Asgard Stories</u> (24 illustrations) Children's book by <u>Mabel Cummings</u> and <u>Mary Foster</u> published in 1901.

<u>Children of Odin (16 illustrations)</u>

Children's book by <u>Ernest Edwin Speight</u> published in 1901. The illustrations in MyNDIR are from the second edition that was published in 1903. Disambiguation: This book should not be confused with *The Children of Odin* by Padriac Colum published in 1920 that was illustrated by Willy Pogany.

<u>Elder or Poetic Edda</u> (34 illustrations)

A dual language edition of the *Poetic Edda* by <u>Olive Bray</u> with illustrations by <u>W. G. Collingwood</u>.

Heroes of Asgard (1857 ed.) (5 illustrations)

The first edition of *The Heroes of Asgard* by <u>Annie Keary</u> and her sister <u>Eliza Keary</u> was published in 1857 and was illustrated by <u>Charles Altamont Doyle</u>.

Heroes of Asgard (1870 ed.) (7 illustrations)

The second illustrated edition of *The Heroes of Asgard* was published in 1870 and illustrated by <u>Louis Huard</u>. These images are from the 1908 reprint.

* <u>Heroes of Asgard (1930 ed.) (86 illustrations)</u>

The third illustrated edition of *The Heroes of Asgard* was published in 1930 and was illustrated by <u>C. E. Brock</u>.

<u>Heroes of the Norselands</u> (9 illustrations)

The Heroes of the Norselands by <u>Katherine F. Boult</u> was illustrated by <u>T. H. Robinson</u>. The first edition was published in 1901.

In the Days of Giants (7 illustrations) *Retelling of Norse Myth* written by <u>Abbie Farwell Brown</u> and illustrated by <u>Elmer Boyd Smith</u>.

Norse Stories, Retold from the Eddas (11 illustrations)

The first edition of *Norse Stories, Retold from the Eddas* by <u>Hamilton Wright Mabie</u> was published in 1882 and illustrated by <u>George Hand Wright</u>.

Wonderful Stories from Northern Lands (6 illustrations) Julia Goddard's collection of retellings based on eddaic poems, sagas and ballads. It was illustrated by W. J. Weigand.

Charlotte Mason (1842-1923)

The longevity of *The Heroes of Asgard* was assured in 1887 when Charlote Mason (1842–1923) founded the Parents' National **Educational Union (PNEU) and included** the Keary sisters' retelling of the Norse myths in "an organized home-school curriculum for families living abroad that promised to solidify an English national identity in their children" (Neiwe Savages or Citizens? Children, Education, and the British Empire, 1899-1950. 2009 Abstract).


Mythology books — stories about our Gods

"Bringing our own religious beliefs into a Charlotte Mason education can present a challenge, simply because there is no pre-made format for us to use.
